## Reading

We have been learning Daily 5, a process to help kids develop independence and responsibility while perfecting their literacy skills.

We are beginning our first unit of Reading Street. We will review consonants M, S, T, P and N, and vowel short A.

We will continue practicing blending sounds to make words. We will work on identifying sounds in words and learning to recognize syllables.

## Math

We have begun our math units with Chapter 1: Addition Concepts We will be continuing Chapter 1. Our Chapter 1 test should be on Wednesday, September $21^{\text {st }}$

## Packet

We have begun doing our regular weekly practice packet. The Packet is a review and responsibility activity. A new packet is assigned each Monday and is due each Friday. It is to be done in class after other work is finished and all pages are to be $100 \%$ correct. The Neptunes are encouraged to turn them in early so that if they made mistakes they can fix them. They are also encouraged to seek help and ask questions. The pages in the packets will generally be pages we already did as classwork. This gives them review of skills we have already learned and begin learning time management. The front of the packet lists the pages and each correct page is starred. The square tells me they turned in the packet if I have to return it for corrections. The star in the box means it is all correct, 10 out of 10 . There are rewards in class for students that manage their time well enough to complete their packets.

## Work Sent Home

I try to send home daily class activities each day so you can see what we are doing and provide help and encouragement as needed. This work does not need to be returned to class unless it is marked "please return." Anything not marked to be returned and that is incomplete, feel free to use it as extra practice.
