Reading

We have been practicing Daily 5, a process to help kids develop independence and responsibility while perfecting their literacy skills.

We are continuing our first unit of Reading Street. We will review consonants G,B, and F, and vowel short I, as well as H, D, L and vowel short O.

We will continue practicing blending sounds to make words. We will work on identifying sounds in words and learning to recognize syllables.

Math

We have begun our math units with Chapter 1: Addition Concepts We will be continuing Chapter 1. Our Chapter 1 test should be on Wednesday, September 21st

Class Blog

Each day, as part of our daily writing we do a journal writing time. All Neptunes are expected to write about ANYTHING they want for 6 minutes. A random selection of the class is than collected and after school I write these entries into our class blog. I adjust the writing to make it more readable for our audience by fixing spellings and sometimes wording in order to make the entry as close to what the writer meant to say as possible, if I can. Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

Have your child write the letter *f* and tell you the sound for *f*. Then take turns saying words that start with f, such as fall, fan, fun, fish, finger, and full. How many words can you name?

Day 2

Have your child write the letter *b* and tell you the sound for b. Work together to write threeletter words using these letters: f, a, b, n, c, t. (fan, ban, fat, bat, tab, cab, can, tan, cat)

Day 3

This week your child is learning the letters *f*, *b*, and g. Write these words on a sheet of paper: fan. bag, gap, tag, nag, nab, gas. Name a word and have your child find it on the paper.

Day 4

Write these words and have your child read them: do, look, you, was, yellow. Write sentences together, using one or more of these words in each sentence. Have your child read the sentences aloud.

Day 5


This week your child is learning about the plot in a story. Read a story to your child. Have your child tell what happens in the story.

Word Match

Materials index cards, pencil, 2 different kinds of game markers, such as pieces of paper or paper clips

Game Directions

- 1. Write a word from the board at the right on each card.
- 2. Shuffle the cards and place them facedown on a table.
- 3. Each player, in turn, picks one card, reads the word aloud, and marks that word on the board with his or her marker.
- 4. The first player to find three words across or down wins!

Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

Have your child write the letter d and tell you the sound for d. Then take turns saying words that start with d, such as doll, dish, dinosaur, dad, deck, and dull. How many words can you name?

Day 2

Have your child write the letter l and tell you the sound for l. Write each of these words on a card or piece of paper: Dan, dig, lag, lip, dip, sip, did, sag, Sid, pig. Place the cards facedown on a table. Take turns picking a card and saying the word aloud.

Day 3

This week your child is learning the letters d, l, and h. Write these words on a sheet of paper: had, lad, dad, his, hat, dig, hit, lid. Spell out a word (d-a-d) and ask your child to say the word aloud. Then ask your child to find the word and circle it on the paper.

Day 4

Write these words and have your child read them: *are, have, they, that, two.* Write sentences together, using one or more of these words in each sentence. Have your child read the sentences aloud.

Day 5


This week your child is learning about realism and fantasy. Read a story to your child. Have your child tell if the story can really happen and why.

Go Home!

Materials paper, pencil, paper clip, 1 button per player

Game Directions

- 1. Make a simple spinner as shown.
