Reading

We are doing Reading Street Unit 1 Week 4 this week. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 1 focus is how people and animals are important to one another. The question of the week is how do wild animals take care of their babies? Our story this week is "A Fox and Kit." We will learn to read, segment and blend words with inflected endings -s and -ing (bats, digs, pins, backing, fixing, jumping). We will learn to identify main ideas and details. We will work on reading accurately. We will learn to identify and write declarative sentences.

Math

We will continue Chapter 3: Addition Strategies. We will solve addition problems. We will tell what happens if we change the order of the addends when we add. We will count on 1, 2, or 3. We will tell what doubles facts are. We will use doubles to help add. We will use what we know about doubles to find other sums. We will use strategies to solve addition fact problems. We will use a ten frame to add 10 and some more. We will use the make a ten strategy to add. We will make a ten to help add. We will add three addends. We will group numbers to add three addends. We will solve addition word problems by drawing a picture. The Chapter 3 test should be Friday, November 4th.

Day 5

This week your child is learning about the main idea and the dteails in a story. As you read stories with your child, discuss with him or her what the story was mainly about.
