Welcome Back

I hope everyone had a fun and relaxing break. We are jumping right back into it as the middle of the year approaches. We are almost halfway done and report cards are just around the corner.

Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 2 Week 4. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 2 focus is what is a community. The question of the week is how do animal communities work together to survive? Our story this week is "The Big Circle". We will learn to read, segment and blend words with long o: o_e and contractions. (bone, chose, hope, home, I'm, can't, she'll, etc). We will learn to identify sequence of a story. We will work on reading sentences with accuracy. We will learn to identify and write proper nouns for days, months and holidays in sentences.

Math

We will begin Chapter 6: Count and Model Numbers. We will use place value to model, read, and write numbers to 120. We will tell how knowing a counting pattern can help us count to 120. We will tell how numbers change as we count by tens to 120. We will use different ways to write a number as tens and ones. We will show a number as tens and ones. We will model and name groups of ten. We will group cubes to show a number as tens and ones. We will show numbers to 100 as tens and ones. We will tell how making a model can help us show a number in different ways. We will model, read, and write numbers from 100 to 110. We will model, read, and write numbers from 110 to 120. The Chapter 6 test should be Tuesday, December 24th.

Labels



Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

On a large piece of paper, write _ o _ e. Make these letter cards: c, h, m, n, p, r, s, t, v, w. Write the following words: note, vote, wove, cove, pose, rose, hope, mope. Take turns placing the correct letter in each blank to form each of the words on the list.

Day 2

Write each of these contractions and the words that make them on separate cards: *I'm*, *we'll*, *you'll*, *can't*, *haven't*, *I am*, *we will*, *you will*, *can not*, *have not*. Mix up the cards and have your child match them.

Day 3

Write the following words in a list: down, inside, now, there, together. Ask your child to read each word and say its opposite.

Day 4

Write each spelling word on a card: home, hope, rose, woke, those, bone, hose, joke, rode, stone. Have your child sort the words into two groups: things you can touch and things you can't touch.

Day 5


This week your child is learning about the order in which events occur in a story. As you read together, have your child tell you what happened first, next, and last in the story.

- 1. Make twelve picture cards similar to the ones shown of the following rhyming words: home, dome; broke, yoke; bone, cone, smoke, rope, slope; rose, nose.
- 2. Shuffle the cards and place them facedown in a pile between you.
- 3. Each player begins by picking two cards. If words on the cards rhyme, the player puts them aside. Play then passes to the next player.
- 4. Play continues until all cards are gone. The player with the most pairs wins!
