## Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 3 Week 2. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 3 focus is what is changing in our world. The question of the week is what do we learn as we grow and change. Our story this week is "Ruby in Her Own Time." We will learn to read, segment and blend words with consonant patterns ng and nk and compound words. (sing, sang, song, drink, drank, drunk, outside, pancake, etc). We will learn to compare and contrast ideas. We will work on reading sentences with appropriate phrasing. We will learn to tell when verbs need to add -s to be right in a sentence.

## Math

We will begin Chapter 7: Compare Numbers. We will use place value to compare numbers. We will compare two numbers to find which is greater. We will compare two numbers to find which is less. We will use symbols to show how numbers compare. We will tell how making a model can help us compare numbers. We will identify numbers that are 10 less or 10 more than a number. The Chapter 7 test should be Thursday, February $9^{\text {th }}$.

Home Activity Your child is learning to spell words with ng and $n k$. To practice at home, have your child spell each word. Then cover the word and ask your child to spell it again.

## Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

## Day 1

Write each word on a card: king, thing, wing, sing, kink, think, wink, sink, sank, tank, bank, thank. Have your child read the words.

## Day 2

Write each compound word: someone, somebody, softball, anybody, anyway, dugout, anyone. Cut the words apart between the two small words. Mix the cards and play a matching game together.

## Day 3

Write any, enough, ever, every, own, sure, and were. Have your child dictate a sentence for each word.

## Day 4

Write each spelling word: bring, trunk, pink,
bank, sang, wing, rink, blank, rang, sunk.
Together, trace the letters as you read the words.

## Day 5

Your child is learning to compare and contrast parts of a story. Ready a story with your child. Discuss what the story tells the reader about the character(s). Ask your child to compare the characters to each other or to someone you know, based on the information given in the story.

## Compound Treasures

Materials paper, marker, scissors, paper clip, pencil, 1 button per player

## Game Directions

1. Make a simple spinner as shown.
2. Players place buttons on Start, take turns spinning, and move the number of spaces shown. Pick one player to be the recorder.
3. Each player must use the word shown on the space with a word from the list below to make a compound word. The recorder writes the word on lined paper. Play continues until all players have reached End.
4. All players then read the list of words they made together.
