Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 3 Week 4. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 3 focus is what is changing in our world. The guestion of the week is what changes happen in a garden. Our story this week is "Frog and Toad Together." We will learn to read, segment and blend words with inflected endings -ed and -ing, and r-controlled -ar. (hop, hopped, hopping, hope, hoped, hoping, arm, far, scarf, etc). We will learn to tell the author's purpose for writing. We will work on rereading sentences with correct expression and tone. We will learn to name verbs that show if things happened in the past or future.

Math

We will begin Chapter 8: Two-Digit Addition and Subtraction. We will add and subtract two-digit numbers. We will tell what strategies we will use to add and subtract. We will add tens. We will subtract tens. We will use a hundred chart to count on by ones or tens. We will tell how models help us add ones or tens to a two-digit number. We will tell how making a ten can help us add a two-digit number and a one-digit number. We will model tens and ones to help us add two-digit numbers. We will tell how drawing a picture can help us explain how to solve an addition problem. We will use a hundred chart to show the relationship between addition and subtraction. We will use different ways to add and subtract.

Home Activity Your child is learning to spell words that end with *-ed*. To practice at home, have your child look at the word, say it, spell it, and then write the word. Help your child see how the word changes when adding *-ed*.

Day 5


This week your child is learning about an author's purpose. Read a short newspaper story about a local event. Have your child retell the story and then discuss why the author wrote this story.


Learning About Adding Endings r-Controlled ar Author's Purpose

Arrrrgh, Matey!

Materials index cards, scissors, marker, real coin

Game Directions

- 1. Cut circles from index cards and label them like the ones shown.
- 2. Shuffle the pieces and place them facedown on the table.
- 3. Each player flips a coin. If it lands heads up, the player takes two pieces. If it lands tails up, the player takes one piece.
- 4. Each player reads aloud the word on the piece. Then he or she must think of a new word that could be formed by changing the letters *ar* to *or* or *ore* to make a new word. For example, *tar* could be changed to *tore*. If the player can think of a new word, he or she can keep the treasure piece.
- 5. Play then passes to the next person. Play continues until all the pieces have been collected.
