Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 3 Week 5. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 3 focus is what is changing in our world. The question of the week is what changes can be seen in nature. Our story this week is "I'm a Caterpillar." We will learn to read, segment and blend words with r-controlled -ir, -er, and -ur; and contractions 's, 've, and 're. (her, stir, fur it's, we've, you're, etc). We will review recognizing fact and opinion. We will work on rereading sentences with correct expression and tone. We will learn to use verbs am, is, are, was, and were in sentences.

Math

We will continue Chapter 8: Two-Digit Addition and Subtraction. We will add and subtract two-digit numbers. We will tell what strategies we will use to add and subtract. We will add tens. We will subtract tens. We will use a hundred chart to count on by ones or tens. We will tell how models help us add ones or tens to a two-digit number. We will tell how making a ten can help us add a two-digit number and a one-digit number. We will model tens and ones to help us add two-digit numbers. We will tell how drawing a picture can help us explain how to solve an addition problem. We will use a hundred chart to show the relationship between addition and subtraction. We will use different ways to add and subtract.

Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

Write these words on cards and turn them face down: *perch, serve, dirt, third, curb, surf.* Take turns picking a card and offering clues so the other person can guess the word. Then have your child read the words.

Day 2

Write these phrases: *she is, they have, we are, he is, you have, you are, we have.* Take turns writing the correct contraction for each phrase.

Day 3

Write the following words in a list: *done, know, push, visit, wait.* Have your child write sentences that use at least one list word in each.

Day 4

Write each spelling word on a card: *her, first, bird, girl, burn, were, shirt, fur, hurt, sir.* Sort the words by rules of your child's choice.

Day 5

This week your child is learning to distinguish fact from opinion. Place an assortment of food items on a tray. Point to each item and make a statement about the item that is either a fact (e.g., the apple is red) or an opinion (e.g., red apples are the best). Ask your child to identify your statement as either fact or opinion. Then reverse roles and have your child make the statements and you identify them as fact or opinion.

Materials green, orange, and yellow crayons

Game Directions

- 1. Together, read the words in the caterpillar.
- 2. Color the *ur* words green. Color the *ir* words orange. Color the *er* words yellow.
- 3. Draw new sections to extend the caterpillar. Ask your child to write as many new words with *ur*, *ir*, and *er* (*shirt*, *nurse*, *purse*, *bird*, *clerk*) as he or she can and color the new sections.
