## Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 4 Week 1. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 4 focus is what do we treasure. The question of the week is how can a surprise be a treasure. Our story this week is a play "Mama's Birthday Present." We will learn to read, segment and blend words with vowel digraphs ai and ay, and singular and plural possessives. (sail, say, boy's, boys', hen's, hens', etc). We will continue working on drawing conclusions. We will work on reading sentences with correct expression and tone. We will learn to name adjectives in sentences.

## Math

We will begin Chapter 9: Measurement. We will measure length and tell time. We will order objects by length. We will compare lengths of three objects to put them in order. We will measure length using nonstandard units. We will use a nonstandard measuring tool to measure length. We will tell how acting it out can help us solve measurement problems. We will tell time to the hour on a clock that has only an hour hand. We will tell time to the half hour on a clock that has only an hour hand. We will tell why the minute hand and hour hand are different for time to the hour and time to the half hour. We will tell whether to draw and write time to the hour or half hour. The Chapter 9 test should be March $28^{\text {th }}$.

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> Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

## Day 1

Help your child write sentences, using as many ai and ay words as possible. Some words to use are: main, wait, paid, aim, day, stay.

## Day 2

Write each word on a card: Kris's, Jake's, Sam's, Kate's, the Smith Family's, the first graders', the lions', the dogs'. Take turns picking a card and thinking of something for them to possess.

## Day 3

Write each spelling word on a card: train, way, tail, play, day, may, rain, gray, mail, afraid. Have your child sort the words into piles by $a i$ and $a y$. Then have your child read the words and spell them aloud.

## One Rainy Day

Materials paper, pencil, paper clip, index cards,
1 button per player

## Game Directions

1. Prepare a set of word cards: aim, gain, rail, main, nail, paid, pain, pail, sail, wait, day, gray, hay, may, maybe, play, say, stay, today, way. Sort the words into $a i$ and $a y$ piles. Prepare a spinner as shown below.
2. Place markers at Start. Players take turns spinning the spinner, moving their button the number of spaces indicated, and then picking a card from the indicated pile. If the player can read the word card correctly, then he or she stays on that space. If not, the player goes back two spaces.
3. If players land in a mud puddle, they must go back one space. If they land on hot chocolate, the other player must go back one space.
4. Play continues until a player reaches End.
