#### Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 5 Week 1. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 5 focus is what difference can a great idea make. The question of the week is when does a problem need a clever solution. Our story this week is "Tippy Toe Chick, Go!" We will learn to read, segment and blend words with diphthongs ow and ou, and ending syllable -le. (brown, cloud, owl, trout, able, candle, etc). We review identifying character, setting, and plot in stories. We will work on reading sentences accurately and more quickly with correct expression and tone. We will learn to name imperative sentences.

#### Math

We will begin Chapter 11: Three-Dimensional Geometry. We will identify and describe three-dimensional shapes. We will identify and describe three-dimensional shapes. Day 5


This week your child is learning about character, setting, and plot. As you read, discuss the change in characters and setting as the story moves from beginning to end.
