### Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 5 Week 2. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 5 focus is what difference can a great idea make. The question of the week is how can we look at things in a different way. Our story this week is "Mole and the Baby Bird." We will learn to read, segment and blend words with diphthongs ow and ou, and syllable patterns V/CV VC/V. (brown, crow, group, loud, robot, robin, etc). We review drawing conclusions. We will work on reading sentences accurately and more quickly with correct expression and tone. We will learn to name pronouns in sentences.

### Math

We will begin Chapter 12: Two-Dimensional Geometry. We will sort and describe two-dimensional shapes. We will use attributes to classify and sort two-dimensional shapes. We will tell what attributes to use to describe two-dimensional shapes. We will put two-dimensional shapes together to make new two-dimensional shapes. We will combine two-dimensional shapes to make new shapes. We will tell how acting it out can help us make new shapes. We will take apart two-dimensional shapes. We will identify equal and unequal parts in two-dimensional shapes. We will identify equal and shape can be separated into two equal shares. We will tell how a shape can be separated into four equal shares. The Chapter 12 test should be May 23<sup>rd</sup>.



# Day 1

Day 2

Read these two-syllable words with your child: *river, bacon, cabin, camel, lemon, pilot, wagon, tiger, decoy.* Together, read them again and clap out the syllables.

Day 3

Encourage your child to write sentences that include the following new words: *door*, *loved*, *should*, *wood*.

# Day 4

Dictate the following spelling words and have your child write them: *mouth*, *house*, *found*, *our*, *out*, *cloud*, *ouch*, *shout*, *round*, *count*. Then have your child underline the *ou* in each word.


# Day 5

## **Spin and Spell**

Materials paper, scissors, paper clip, pencil, 1 button per player

### **Game Directions**

- 1. Make a simple spinner as shown.
- 2. Players take turns spinning and then naming and spelling a word with *ou* and the vowel sound as in *out* and *cow*. Possible words: *our*, *sound*, *about*, *round*, *scout*, *loud*, *cloud*, *count*, *trout*, *out*, *ouch*, *down*, *town*, *brown*, *how*, *now*, *cow*, *plow*, *growl*.
- 3. If the word is spelled correctly, the player may move that number of spaces as shown on the spinner.
- 4. Play continues until all players reach End.
