Reading

We will do Reading Street Unit 5 Week 4. Our spelling and reading tests will be Thursday. The Unit 5 focus is what difference can a great idea make. The question of the week is how can a great idea make our lives easier. Our story this week is "Simple Machines." We will learn to read, segment and blend words with diphthongs oi and oy, and suffixes —er and -or. (avoid, oil, cowboy, joy, actor, editor, leader, writer, etc). We will review naming main ideas and details. We will work on reading sentences with correct phrasing. We will review naming pronouns in sentences.

Math

We will continue Chapter 12: Two-Dimensional Geometry. We will sort and describe two-dimensional shapes. We will use attributes to classify and sort twodimensional shapes. We will tell what attributes to use to describe two-dimensional shapes. We will put twodimensional shapes together to make new twodimensional shapes. We will combine two-dimensional shapes to make new shapes. We will tell how acting it out can help us make new shapes from combined shapes. We will find shapes in other shapes. We will take apart two-dimensional shapes. We will identify equal and unequal parts in two-dimensional shapes. We will tell how a shape can be separated into two equal shares. We will tell how a shape can be separated into four equal shares. The Chapter 12 test should be May 23rd.

Day 5


This week your child is learning about the big idea in a story and the details that tell about the main idea. As you read, discuss the big idea for the story and identify one detail.
