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Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

Day 2

Write these word parts on a card: *ost, old, ind, ild.* Take turns picking a card and thinking of a word that rhymes with that word part. Answers could include: *most, post, fold, mold, find, kind, mild, wild.*

Day 3

Write the following words in a list: *answered*, *carry*, *different*, *poor*. Together, write and read sentences using the words.

Day 4


Write the spelling words in a list: *unhappy*, *refill*, *untie*, *undo*, *repay*, *unkind*, *undress*, *retell*, *reopen*, *rewind*. Have students copy each word on a card or small piece of paper and sort the words according to prefixes.

Day 5

This week your child is learning about theme. Recall the story you made up about a bad day. Retell the story as a good day by changing the outcome of the events. Ask you child to rename the story and draw a new picture.

- 1. Make a simple spinner as shown.
